- Bachelor of Arts in Philology, concentration in Business Communication and Translation in English

Upon completing the **graduate study program**, the students earn one of the following degrees:

- Master of Arts in Philology, concentration in Teaching English Language and Literature
- Master of Arts in Philology, concentration in Business Communication and Translation in English
- Master of Arts in Philology, concentration in Creative Writing

Graduate studies are available as:

- one-year program (60 ECTS), for students who have completed 4 years of undergraduate studies (4+1)
- two-year program (120 ECTS) for students who have completed 3 years of undergraduate studies (3+2)
